Carl Edward Lamphere of Marion passed away Thursday, February 6, 2025 at Munson Healthcare Cadillac Hospital. He was 85. Carl was born on February 3, 1940 in Cadillac to Lloyd H. & Laura I. (Edwards) Lamphere.

Carl graduated from Cadillac High School in 1958 and went on to Ferris State University and Eastern Michigan University receiving a Bachelor's degree. Carl served in the United States Army from 1958-1961. He had been employed as the chief of the Survey Section of the United States Army Corp of Engineers in Detroit for over 30 years.

He was a member of the Kiwanis Club of Cadillac for many years and he will be remembered for his generosity, for helping Veterans and others in the community.
