Clarice M. Bryan of Cadillac passed away Monday evening, February 10, 2014 at the Curry House Assisted Living and Memory Care in Cadillac. She was 87. She was born on February 1, 1927 in Kettering, Northhamptonshire, England to Mark & Maude Brooks.
