Glen B. Corp of Cadillac passed away June 3, 2024 at Curry House Assisted Living in Cadillac. He was 99. He was born March 16, 1925 in Olive Township, Clinton County to Glen B. and Emma Lucile (Chadwick) Corp, Sr. at the time the area was mostly farmland.

On January 15, 1946 in Grand Ledge Glen married Eunice B. Ayers and she preceded him in death on June 1, 2012. They enjoyed many winters in Hawaii together and 66 years of marriage.
