



## Harry Allen Ghent

March 16, 1932 - October 8, 2025

Harry Allen Ghent, a veteran of the Korean and Vietnam wars, passed away on October 8, 2025. Known throughout his life for his sharp wit and love of Pure Michigan nature, he was born and raised in Lake County, Michigan. He graduated from Baldwin High School before enlisting in the U.S. Air Force. He met and married his wife, Eunice Anne “Angie” Crabtree when he was stationed at the Air Force Base in Lincoln, Nebraska. Senior Master Sergeant Ghent received the Air Force commendation medal for meritorious service in the Strategic Air Command and was awarded numerous additional medals throughout his distinguished career.

After more than 20 years of service, Harry and his wife Angie returned to Baldwin and opened Harry’s Shell Service Station. Later he became the property manager of the Neboshone. Harry also drove a school bus for Pine River and Reed City schools. He loved improving their homes and properties in Lake, Osceola, and Wexford counties in Michigan.

As “snowbirds”, Harry and Angie enjoyed traveling the country in their RV. They also actively served at Edgett’s Wesleyan Church including countless hours assisting with the food pantry as part of Feed America.

Harry was preceded in death by two children Joyce Anne and Lois Marie. He is survived by children Edith, Beverley, Donald, and Anthony; grandchildren Shawn, Chelsea, Rachel, Michaela, and Katie; great- grandchildren Conner, Carson, Carter, and Beau; and his beloved dog of 15 years, Spooky.
