Henry "Bud" Schut of Cadillac passed away Tuesday morning, February 28, 2017 at Samaritas Senior Living in Cadillac. He was 91. "Bud" was born April 20, 1925 in Lucas, Michigan to John J. and Helen (Yonkman) Schut. Mr. Schut attended school in Lucas, and in 1944 he entered the United States Army and served during World War II. "Bud" had been employed at Chris Craft, Kysor Industrial and Inland Lake Machine Shop in Cadillac and had also been a self-employed carpenter for many years. Mr. Schut was a member of St. Ann Catholic Church in Cadillac, Knights of Columbus #1224 and the American Legion Post #94 of Cadillac. "Bud" loved Detroit Tiger Baseball, rabbit hunting, deer hunting, fishing and to dance the polka. In October of 2015 Henry had the opportunity to go on the Mid-Michigan Honor Flight and was proud to go with his grandson Andrew Schut, who was an Afghanistan/Iraq war Veteran.
