December 8, 1931 - March 11, 2013

Hermina Boes of McBain went to be with her Lord on Monday March 11, 2013 at Autumnwood of McBain. She was 81. She was born on December 8, 1931 in Osceola County to John & Ida (Schierbeek) VanDyke and they preceded her in death.

She graduated from Northern Michigan Christian High School in McBain and also from Reformed Bible College in Grand Rapids. Later Mrs. Boes went to nursing school in Chicago where she received her Registered Nursing Degree at Roseland Community Hospital School of Nursing in 1957 and had served as class President. She had been employed at Mercy Hospital in Cadillac. Hermina was a member of Lucas Christian Reformed Church all her life and been a member of the Ladies Aide, Mission Study Club and also taught Girls Club. She enjoyed knitting, crocheting, making and donating baby blankets to the hospital. Hermina had also been active with Northern Michigan Christian School fund raising.

On May 12, 1961 at the Lucas Christian Reformed Church she married Donald L. Boes and he survives her along with sons: Bryan Boes of Cadillac, Bradley (Shelley) Boes of Ludington, and Brent (Kathryn) Boes of Cadillac; 8 grandchildren. In addition to her parents she was preceded in death by her brother, Marvin VanDyke.

Funeral services will be held 11:00 AM Thursday, March 14, 2013 at the Lucas Christian Reformed Church with Reverend Steve VanNoort and Reverend Gerry Heyboer officiating. Burial will be at Lucas Cemetery in Missaukee
