Larry Keith Lindbert of Cadillac passed away Thursday morning, October 29, 2015 at Munson Medical Center in Traverse City. He was 79. Larry was born on February 18, 1936 in Indianapolis, Indiana to Lorain K. & Edith M. (Cherry) Lindbert and they preceded him in death.
