



## Lee E. Crandall

October 6, 1935 - March 25, 2018

Lee E. Crandall of Cadillac, lifelong Michigan resident passed away peacefully, Sunday, March 25, 2018 at his home with his loving family by his side. He was 82.

Lee was born on October 6, 1935 in Detroit to Fred G. & Madeline M. (Lee) Crandall and they preceded him in death.

Lee had served in the United States Navy during the Korean War. He was employed at Ford Motor Company for over 20 years and after his retirement he was a self-employed builder for many years.
