February 26, 1932 - January 30, 2015

Leonard A. Fettig of Cadillac passed away Friday, January 30, 2015 at Autumnwood of McBain. He was 82. He was born on February 26, 1932 in Petoskey to Leonard & Sophia (Rebel) Fettig and they preceded him in death.

Leo graduated from Cadillac High School in 1951 and played football on the only team that went undefeated for all four years. He served in the United States Army during the Korean War. Mr. Fettig was the Co-owner of Fettig & Sons Grocery Store in Cadillac and retired in 1978. He was a member of St. Ann Catholic Church in Cadillac and a Life member of the Knights of Columbus and the AMVETS Post #110 of Cadillac. He also enjoyed watching Detroit Lions football and fishing.

Survivors include his sister, Lucille Wilkins of Broadview, Montana; sister-in-law, Mary Anne Fettig Lanning of Cadillac and several nieces and nephews.

In addition to his parents he was preceded in death by a sister, Ann Hermatz and 3 brothers: Richard, Jerome "Jet" and David Fettig.

A Memorial Mass of Christian Burial will be held 10:00 AM Friday, February 6, 2015 at St. Ann Catholic Church in Cadillac with Msgr. Francis J. Murphy as celebrant and full military rites under the auspices of the Cadillac Area Honor Guard. His final resting place will be Mount Carmel Cemetery in Cadillac.
