Margie V. Oderkirk Wiener of Charlevoix formerly of Cadillac passed away Thursday, February 23, 2017 at her home. She was 96.

Margie was born on April 23, 1920 in Green County, Arkansas to Willy & Eva (Wood) Riley. On April 12, 1936 in Flint she married George Roland Oderkirk and he preceded her in death on December 5, 1983. On June 13, 1986 in Florida she married Andrew Wiener and he preceded her in death on August 13, 2002.

Margie had been the owner and operator of the Green Door and Margie's Lunch in Flint as well as the Town Talk in Lake City, Johnny's Grill in Cadillac and the Lake City Hotel. She loved to cook, bake bread, cookies and was famous for her hamburgers and cabbage rolls. Margie was known as a social butterfly, and loved to dance and as an artist enjoyed painting and crocheting.

Survivors include her children: Beverly Jean Frank of Myrtle Beach, SC, Mary Jewell (Jack) Linn of Flint, and Andrea Neihardt of Traverse City; 16 grandchildren; many great grandchildren and many great-great grandchildren.
