Max J. Johnson of Cadillac passed away Thursday evening, February 14, 2013 at Mercy Hospital in Cadillac. He was 84. He was born August 1, 1928 in Burdell Township to Carl D. and Agnes T. (Watson) Johnson.

Max lived in the area most of his life and had graduated from Tustin High School. He served in the United States Army in the Ski and Mountain Troops during the Korean Conflict. Max worked at Wedin Corporation for 30 years until retiring in 1990. He had also worked part time for the Department of Natural Resources. He was a member of the Covenant Presbyterian Church in Tustin. He was a past president of Friends of Carl T. Johnson Museum and volunteered at the hunting and fishing center.
