



Paul William "Bubba" Feldhauser

January 30, 1954 - March 25, 2015

Paul William "Bubba" Feldhauser of Cadillac passed away Wednesday, March 25, 2015 at Munson Healthcare Cadillac Hospital. He was 61.

Paul was born January 30, 1954 in Grayling, Michigan to Charles and Dolores (Golnick) Feldhauser. He graduated from West Bloomfield High School. Paul retired from the Naval Reserve Seabees Construction Battalion. He returned to Northern Michigan and began working at Dunbar Excavating, Inc. as a heavy equipment operator for ten years. Paul had currently been working for Clous Construction Inc. in Cadillac for over 25 years.

He enjoyed hunting, fishing, watching sports on television, gardening and spending time with family. Paul had a quick wit and great sense of humor. He was always ready and willing to help others.
