Reva Ann (Conklin-Hillard) Beaupre of Cadillac passed away Saturday morning, January 9, 2016 at the Curry House Assisted Living in Cadillac. She was 89. Reva was born on January 19, 1926 in Coalinga, California to Clarence & Ann (Sincock) Bonniwell. Reva married Elvin Hillard and later married Michael Beaupre on December 28, 1984 and he preceded her in death on December 24, 2000.
