Robert Lee Barrons of Cadillac passed away Tuesday, June 25, 2024 at Samaritas Senior Living. He was 81. Bob was born September 11, 1942 in Cadillac to Robert and Marie L. (Loomis) Barrons.

Bob attended Cadillac High School and was an accomplished athlete in football, basketball and track. After high school Bob served in the United States Army as a medic. Bob was proud of his time in the service and was deeply patriotic; always flying the American Flag proudly.

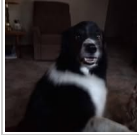
