Ruth A. Sundberg of Cadillac passed away Monday morning, January 9, 2017 at Samaritas Senior Living in Cadillac. She was 90.

Ruth was born October 9, 1926 in Highland Park, Michigan to William E. and Arvilla M. (Hill) Ringler, III. She married Harold Sundberg, Jr. on September 6, 1958 in East Detroit, Michigan and he also preceded her in passing on Aug. 14, 2015.

Ruth began a career in nursing as a member of the U.S. Cadet Nursing Corps in World War II. She graduated from Hurley School of Nursing and became a Registered Nurse in the State of Michigan. She worked at Hurley Hospital in Flint, was an office Nurse in Clio, at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit and at Lakeview Manor in Cadillac.

Ruth was very active as a volunteer with the Wexford County Humane Society and was a member of the Sweet Adelines.

She is survived by sisters, Dorothea A. Peters of Clio and Kay Shoens of Essexville; nieces: Kathryn (Gary) Domerese, Susan (Tom) Rollo, Patricia Colomina and their children; extended family and many friends in Michigan, Vermont, and New Hampshire.

Ruth was preceded in death by her parents, husband Harold on August 14, 2015 and a step-father.

In accordance with her wishes cremation has taken place and a memorial service will be held at a later date.

A celebration of Ruth's life will be held 1:30 pm Saturday, January 28, 2017 at Samaritas Senior Living Chapel in Cadillac with Chaplain Richard Anderson officiating.

Her final resting place will be Sunset Hills Cemetery in Flint, Michigan.
